Now in its 27th year, Sojourner House continues to provide a safe, supportive atmosphere for recovery for mothers and their children. Facing recovery as a mother is always a challenge. They fear losing their children and the stigma often associated with mothers who abuse drugs. All of us have heard the phrase, "She's such a good mother." That's a lot to live up to.

In 2015, 2.5 million women were addicted to alcohol or another drug. Sadly, a majority of them do not receive treatment for the reasons mentioned above.

Sojourner House offers the opportunity for mothers and children to stay together in their own apartment for up to six months while receiving family-centered treatment. With opiate addiction in full swing, a baby is born suffering from Opioid withdrawal every 25 minutes in the United States. Untreated opioid addiction during pregnancy can have devastating effects on the fetus.

During the course of the last year, 17 mothers entered the Sojourner House treatment program who were pregnant (27%). These mothers were given the opportunity to obtain pre-natal care, learn about "parenting sober," and to deliver a more healthy baby.

The Sojourner House MOMS permanent housing program, provides housing and recovery services to families committed to re-building their lives for themselves and their children. Last year, 59 families entered the MOMS program and almost 65% remained clean and sober.

These services have been made possible through the support of many people in the Pittsburgh Community. The organization is guided by an active, invested Board of Directors who understand the impact of addiction on families. They work hard to insure the resources necessary to help families recover, are provided.

Most important, is the time and dedication provided through the volunteers and donors like you. It is you that give the families a chance to recover. Thank you.
